Performance Management arrangements for the Children, Young People and Families' Plan 2013-16:

1. Background

- 1.1 The Children, Young People and Families' Plan is in place for 2013-2016 which requires a performance management framework. This document summarises the performance management arrangements.

2. Policy Context

- 2.1 The new plan brings together a range of priorities and activities within one vision. It identifies how we will improve outcomes for children, young people and families in the city. It defines how the Children and Young People's Strategic Partnership contributes to the Mandate for Change and the Joint Health and Wellbeing Strategy.

3. Key Features

- 3.1 The key features of the framework are:

- Priority champions
- Priority leads
- Priority groups with supporting plans and task and finish groups as appropriate.
- Outcome/ impact reports based on performance indicators and proxy measures
- High-level reporting by exception on the 5 priorities using Red/Amber/Green rating for progress against key actions.
- Focussed discussion on each priority

3.2 Priority champions

Priority Champions:

- champion one of the 5 priorities at Board level.
- promote their respective priorities within their own organisation, partnerships and networks.
- present high-level progress and performance updates for their priorities to the Board and take questions and challenges (with support from priority leads).
- identify high-level links and alignment between their respective priorities.
- identify high-level issues and obstacles to progress of the priorities and discuss and recommend solutions.

3.3 **Priority leads**

Priority leads:

- take a coordinating role implementation of respective priorities (supported by the Strategic Governance and Planning Team)
- maintain an overview of the range of plans, actions and groups contributing to the delivery of respective priorities (supported by the Strategic Governance and Planning Team)
- provide high-level performance and progress updates for respective priorities to priority champions for presentation at the Board (supported by the Strategic Governance and Planning and Performance teams)
- act upon proposals and recommendations from the Board for respective priorities.
- contribute to annual reports of the CYPF plan.

3.4 **Priority groups**

Priority groups:

- Take a collective lead on the delivery of the supporting plans and strategies for the 5 priorities
- Set up task and finish groups as appropriate.
- Identify issues and obstacles to progress and implement partnered solutions to overcome these issues.
- Consider and act upon recommendations from the CYPSP Board.
- Support priority champions in providing reports on progress for priority champions and the CYPSP Board.

3.6 **Performance monitoring and reporting**

3.7 A quarterly report will be produced and have a section for each of the 5 priorities. In each section there will be monitoring of the relevant measures in graphical form with commentary on the performance trend, followed by an update on the actions completed since the previous report. The overall action progress would be 'RAG' rated - green on track and progress is as expected, amber would indicate that some actions are slightly off -track and red would indicate seriously off- track with concerns that need to be highlighted. The report then concludes with the highlighting of any risks and an overall summary.

3.8 The board reviews all 5 priorities by exception focusing its attention on the

challenges and issues that are barriers to progress and discuss and recommend solutions. Champions, and leads where required, support the reporting of the priority to the Board.
